# GOSPEL CENTERED DAILY DEVOTIONALS

#### WHAT IS THE GOSPEL?

The Good News that God loves the world and offers salvation from sin through His Son, Jesus Christ (Psalm 103:1–13; Isaiah 53:4–5; John 3:16–17; 1 Corinthians 15:1–5).

#### DAILY DEVOTIONALS

Take 20 minutes each morning to set aside a time of quiet devotion to the Lord. Pray. Ask the Holy Spirit to speak to you through the reading of Scripture and praying of the Collects. As you begin each day, be reminded of the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

### Monday (9/23) — Read: Hebrews 12:1-17; Psalm 61, 62

Pray: O God, the King eternal, whose light divides the day from the night and turns the shadow of death in to the morning: Drive far from us all wrong desires, incline our hearts to keep your law, and guide our feet into the way of peace; that, having done your will with cheerfulness during the day, we may, when night comes, rejoice to give you thanks; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## Tuesday (9/24) — Read: Hebrews 12:18-29; Psalm 68:1-18

Pray: O God, the author of peace and the lover of concord, to know you is eternal life and to serve you is perfect freedom: Defend us, your humble servants, in all assaults of our enemies; that we, surely trusting in your defense, may not fear the power of any adversaries, through the might of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## Wednesday (9/25) — Read: Matthew 18:15-35; Psalm 69:1-18

Pray: O Lord, our heavenly Father, almighty and everlasting God, you have brought us safely to the beginning of this day: Defend us by your mighty power, that we may not fall into sin nor run into any danger; and that, guided by your Spirit, we may do what is righteous in your sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
